Buy Property Using a Trust

WHY IT HELPS

When you buy a house, your name usually ends up in public records. But if a trust owns the home, your name doesn't appear.

WHO IT HELPS

People who want privacy — like public figures, executives, or anyone who's been targeted before.

TIE

Ask a lawyer about setting up a trust before you buy property.

Use a Business Address, Not Your Home

WHY IT MATTERS

When you register a business (even a side hustle), your address goes into public databases.

BETTER OPTION

- · Use a virtual address
- · A co-working space
- · Or a registered business address

This keeps your home private

Be Careful Where You List Your Address

DO NOT SHARE YOUR HOME ADDRESS UNLESS YOU ABSOLUTELY MUST

This includes:

- Social media profiles
- · Online shopping sites
- · Public records and directories

TIP

Search your name + address online — see what's visible and request removal where possible.



NEED EXTRA PROTECTION?

Some states offer something called an Address Confidentiality Program (ACP).

WHAT IT DOES

- Gives you a legal "fake" address to use for mail
- Keeps your real home address out of public records
- Helps protect people at risk (like stalking or harassment)

WHO IT'S FOR

- People who've been threatened or stalked
- Survivors of domestic violence
- Public-facing professionals who feel unsafe
